Cyber risk is everywhere. Read on for a few examples of what can, and has gone wrong.

### *Manufacturing*

A sweet's manufacturer notified approximately 12,000 customers who purchased items through the company's online store. Malicious code was found on the website's checkout page, which could capture customer names, addresses, phone numbers, fax numbers, payment card type, payment card numbers, expiration dates, and verification codes.

Total Payout: \$52,000

**R**

### *Restaurant*

The point of sale systems of a U.S.-based restaurant chain, were compromised through a third-party vendor's system, giving hackers the ability to install malware to capture the payment card information of customers between August 2017 and February 2019.

Total Payout: \$650,000

**H**

### *Healthcare*

Patients of a medical service were notified of a 16-month long data-breach. Approximately 42,000 individuals had their sensitive personal and health information exposed, including medical histories, insurance information, Social Security numbers, names, phone numbers, and addresses.

Total Payout: \$2,500,000

**S**

### *Social Services*

A state Department of Human Services announced a data breach after nine of its employees clicked on a phishing link, compromising nearly 2 million emails. These emails may have exposed the names, addresses, dates of birth, Social Security numbers, and other information of as many as 1.6 million clients.

Total Payout: \$68,050

**H**

### *Hospitality*

A casino had a ransomware attack that resulted in a \$150,000 ransomware payment. As a result of the ransomware attack, the casino was shut down for three days causing further damages and losses.

Total Payout: \$800,000

**N**

### *Non-Profit*

A non-profit's computer system were breached to extort them by threatening to release the employee login credentials. The hackers also engaged in a cyber attack that brought down their entire computer system for more than a month.

Total Payout: \$1,606,550
